April: The Very Busy Month



CADA DIA CHEESE

HARD CHEESE FROM COW TO KETTLE

Cada Dia means "every day" in Spanish. We chose this name for our seasonal dairy because that is what we do – make cheese every day – but only seasonally! The growing season and irrigation water for ur 60 acres of grass/clover pasture runs from April through October. That is when we grow pasture, and that is when we make cheese. 100% pasture-fed milk is high in Omega-3, just like salmon. It is also high in CLA, conjugated linoleic acid, a potent natural cancer fighter.

We milk our 20 Jersey cows once a day. This warm milk is poured into the cheese vat within minutes of leaving the cow. No heating is necessary. The milk leaves the cow at cheese making temperature! Each cow's milk is filtered and quality controlled before it is added to the cheese vat. It could not be any cleaner or fresher. Making cheese in this manner with incredibly fresh and clean milk, makes pasteurization unnecessary. In fact, as any cheese maker will tell you, raw (unpasteurized) milk is the very best for making cheese. We don't cool the milk down and re-heat it back up to cheese making temperature, so we use less energy. We don't worry about unwanted bacteria multiplying in our milk because – how can they? Bacteria obviously need time to multiply. Our system denies them this time.
