FIRST THURSDAY LUNCHEON SPEAKER

Tonya Karlowicz currently serves as the Attendance Secretary for La Pine High School. She has worked in various support capacities within public schools for the past sixteen years, with the last eleven working within Bend La Pine Schools. In her most current position, which she has filled for just over four years, she is supporting school attendance of youth in a rural area with a high rate of socioeconomic disadvantage. Her graduation with a Bachelor of Science in Human Development Family Studies in 2014 from Oregon State University led her to continue her education at Goddard College where she earned a Master of Arts in Education in 2016. Studying theory while working gave way to many opportunities for application of practices related to building resilience in trauma-affected youth, including the implementation of restorative justice practices at La Pine High School.
